A recent service included news of Leicester City of Sanctuary and a dedication of a young child. John Rackley, Baptist minister reflects on the occasion.

I start with two quotations from the bible which emphasise the value and significance of each life. Each of us is unique – this is what it means to be made in the image of God.

I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.
My frame was hidden, when I was made in secret,
Intricately woven in the depths of the earth.

In his book: Anam Cara John O'Donohue writes
Humans are new here.
Above us the galaxies dance out towards infinity.
Under our feet is ancient earth.
We are beautifully moulded from this clay.
Yet the smallest stone is millions of years older than us.

We are characters in a production that's been running for 14 billion years, and our roles were written for us long before we appeared on the scene.

All of us are on the stage at the moment; we have our part and then will disappear Like the 100 billion human beings who preceded us.

And that's why a dedication is so important for Gabriel but it is more than a pleasant child-centred occasion for us all.

And that's why City of Sanctuary is more than a crucial piece of human care or social justice.

They are emerge from the faith, conviction that we, each of us are no accident.

We each have a part to play in the great story of this universe.

We are part of the great weaving of life.

Donald Nichol who was Director of the Tantur Institute in Bethlehem writes of a time when he descended the five mile path down into the Grand Canyon.

As you descend you can observe the walls. They are made of layer upon layer of the sediments that have formed over millions of years, and you can relate those layers to the successive species of living creatures, both fauna and flora, that dwelt upon the earth before we appeared: Permian ferns and crinoids and armour-plated fish.

Observing the traces of them in this way I felt a true kinship with all those forms of life; with them I had to trace our existence back to the first moment of transcendence when life appeared on this earth.

And then I realised that the very eyes with which I was observing all this are themselves the result of millions of years of striving for light, ever since the first pin-hole appeared on those primitive marine creatures, the cephalopods.

I, you and I are the beneficiary of that entire struggle for light, the heir of all that agony. Had any breakdown in that series of stirrings occurred at any time, it could have destroyed that possibility for us to hear and see and sing. The breakdown was prevented by the untiring faithfulness on the part of millions of beings.

And then he concluded with this:

As I arrived breathless and hot 7,000 feet below the ridge at the top, the level at which we now live; I knew what an incredibly hard-won privilege it is simply to be a human being; and at the same time it is an awesome responsibility. Every human being has a responsibility towards all those creatures whose agony and groaning has given us birth.

And I must add and to all those who will follow after us.
